CRITICAL RACE PEDAGOGY FOR ANTIRACIST, EQUITY-MINDED, AND INCLUSIVE LANGUAGE TEACHING

This workshop will be realized in two parts. In the first, participants will examine research on experiences of Black and other minoritized students in world language classrooms. They will discuss anti-Black racism and inequity in access, treatment, representation, and experiences in classes, texts, and teaching materials, and they will learn how the theoretical framework of critical race theory (CRT) facilitates a clearer understanding of these problems. In the second part of the workshop, attendees will be asked to consider how different groups of minoritized students can authentically and effectively participate in language learning and how teachers can contribute to their success. They will be introduced to a CRT-informed protocol to examine instructional materials (e.g., lesson plans, textbooks, online learning platforms) they bring to the presentation and make proposals for immediate, short, and longterm change. Attendees will also learn how to enact a critical race pedagogy for world language teaching (CRPWLT) to promote antiracist, equity-minded, and inclusive practices that help Black and other minoritized students succeed in world language studies.
